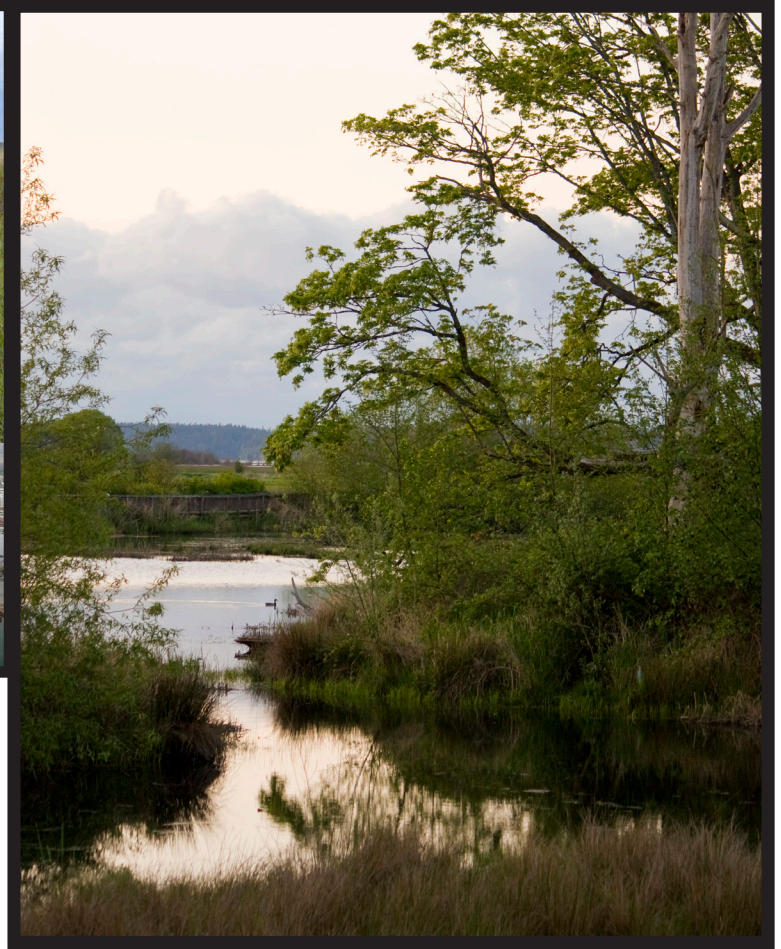

The Nisqually National Wildlife Refuge, in partnership with Ducks Unlimited and the Nisqually Indian Tribe, restored tidal waters to 762 acres of the Refuge by removing 5 miles of the Brown Farm Dike in the fall of 2009. **Jesse Barham** (Refuge Restoration Biologist) will talk about the restoration process and construction, **Kelley Turner** (USGS Biologist) will speak about the preliminary results of the USGS monitoring including both physical and biological responses, and **Christopher Ellings** (Nisqually Tribe Salmon Research Biologist) will talk about preliminary results of ongoing fish ecology monitoring.
